ROBERT HARMER DIES AT HIS HOME IN TORONTO

Prominent Industrial Leader of Ontario Passes in 70th Year.

TORONTO, June 26.—One of Ontario's industrial chiefs, Robert Harmer, died at his home here tonight in his 70th year. He was president of the Sawyer-Massey Company of Hamilton; president of Canada Furniture Manufacturers Company, Woodstock; president of the Seaman-Kent Company, Toronto; and a director of the Gray-Dort Company of Chatham, Ontario.
Mr. Harmer was ill 18 months, suffering from pernicious anemia, the malady having become acute two months ago. Born in England, he came to Canada at an early age and entered the service of the Massey-Harris Company, about 50 years ago. His ability was such that he won rapid promotion, and at the time some years ago when he severed his connection with the company to take up other interests, he was general sales manager, the company's foreign business having been built up largely through his efforts.
He is survived by his widow, formerly Miss Emily A. Richardson of England; two sons, Dr. Charles Harmer, Paris, France, and H. R. Harmer, Montreal, and three daughters, Mrs. T. A. Hunt, Winnipeg; Mrs. E. A. Johnson, North Gower, Ont., and Mrs. H. K. Patterson, Winnipeg.

SHOWS OVER TEN MILLION EGGS IN COLD STORAGE

Report of Dominion Bureau of Statistics for June Issued at Ottawa.

Ottawa, June 26.—A report on the cold storage holdings for the month of June, 1922, issued by the Dominion bureau of statistics, is as follows: The butter in storage amounts to 2,802,073 pounds of creamery and 107,622 pounds of dairy, a decrease of 1.33 per cent in each case of creamery, and 44.96 per cent for dairy as compared with the corresponding month last year.
Cheese in storage amounts to 5,967,979 pounds, an increase of 112.27 per cent from last June.
Eggs in cold storage total 10,586,315 726 dozen, frozen eggs 786,479 dozen; other than cold storage 871, an increase in cold storage eggs of 17.76 per cent. While other than cold storage eggs increased 8.66 per cent over last year. Frozen eggs increased 27.81 per cent from last year.

He now intends to land at Spitzbergen, instead of Cape Columbia, as had been planned. A Norwegian air officer is going to Spitzbergen to mark out a suitable landing place.

W. Mullinder of Windsor did the 200 yards from the lot line of Renaud's home to the town hall in "between four and five seconds." Renaud told the court. Magistrate W. E. Gundy held the evidence insufficient to convict.
When Mullinder suggested that the affair "could be fixed up for \$2," Renaud told him he "couldn't be bought for \$2 or for \$50," he testified.

Uncle Sam Canada's Best Customer For Twelve Months Ending in May

OTTAWA, June 26.—The United States was Canada's chief customer in the twelve months ending May, 1921, \$525,198,321. Both imports and exports, however, fell off as compared with the corresponding period of the previous year. In the twelve months ending May, 1922, imports from the United States were \$502,716,863 in comparison with \$512,331,823 for the twelve months ending May, 1921. Canadian exports to the United States in the two twelve months periods were: Ending May, 1922, \$288,162,041; ending May, 1921, \$525,198,321.
The United Kingdom was Canada's next best customer. Imports from the United Kingdom in the twelve months ending May, 1922, were \$114,079,587; in the twelve months ending May, 1921, \$192,461,463.
Exports to the United Kingdom in the twelve months ending May, 1922, were \$301,643,528, as compared with \$316,090,595 in the corresponding twelve months previous.

DIPS GET \$2,000 WON ON PONIES

HAMILTON, June 26.—For six races at the opening of the Hamilton Jockey Club spring meet today Martin Delory, proprietor of the Maple Leaf Hotel, opposite the armories, picked the bangtails right. Then, as Mart descended the grandstand stair, three pickpockets picked him right. They cleaned him out of \$2,000. Later city Detectives Bucket and Thompson and three Pinkerton operatives picked up three of Mr. Delory's hotel guests at the depot. Ralph Hart, barber, Buffalo; Lawrence Temple, actor, Buffalo and Harry Lawrence, salesman Chicago, are held on nominal charges of vagrancy. The \$2,000 is still missing.

ANXIOUS ABOUT RATHENAU POST
Berlin, June 26.—Selection of a man to fill the post of foreign minister, vacated by the assassination of Dr. Walter Rathenau, presents difficulties of some magnitude to Chancellor Wirth.
The friends of Dr. Otto Ludwig Wiedfeldt, ambassador to the United States, have already suggested him as an available candidate, stressing his qualifications as an economist.

CUT GASOLINE PRICES.
WOODSTOCK, June 26.—As the result of what is reported to be a war among the vendors of gasoline in the city and district, motorists are enjoying a reduction in the ruling price of close to five cents per gallon. The price now is 35 cents.
