AGAINST INCREASE IN MAJOR'S LIMIT

Prexy J. Conway Toole Says Younger Players Not Lack Chance.

New York, Dec. 9.—It seems certain today that there will be the strongest kind of opposition to any suggestion that there be an increase in the number of men a club can hold under option.

While not directly stating to his colleagues that he would work for a reduction of the present number allowed, John Conway Toole, president of the International League, made it rather plain that he will vigorously oppose a larger number.

Toole told the writer he believes 25 players are quite sufficient for major and the minors both.

"This stand of Toole's is really a progressive step, since the owners are constantly complaining about the scarcity of players and are wondering where to get more for their minor league teams."

"On trouble, and a big one, with baseball clubs of the major league, is that with so many men on the bench the younger players do not get the proper amount of playing time."

The majors get players and send them to the minors, where they are not under the observation of major league managers, and where they, obviously, do not get the kind of work they should.

No successful manager can stay successful and handle forty men. That's why the owners are constantly complaining about the scarcity of players and are wondering where to get more for their minor league teams."

"When the minors are benefited more is done to build up baseball than could be done in any other way, because ultimately the majors get the benefit themselves."

It is possible that W. H. Kieffer of the Portland, Oregon Club, who was suspended from the National Association of Minor Leagues, will not bring suit after all against the organization. At Louisville he declared he would do so, and his lawyer said the same thing.

Since then, however, there has been a consultation, at which it is believed Kieffer may have been convinced that he should not bring suit.

For the time being, there may come a time in the future when the National Association of Minor Leagues will be resolved, and the Portland man returned to good standing.
