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DOG ANDREWS MUST GO TO TRIAL.

The Murder Case Will Be Tried at This Court - Postponement This Fall Deferred.

At the Assize Court yesterday the grand jury brought in true bills for murder against "Dog" Andrews, Alice Andrews, his wife, and the doctor, Dr. W. R. Meredith, Q.C., who was arraigned and all pleaded not guilty.

The Doctor, in a weak and quavering voice, requested the judge to lay the case over for several days.

Mr. W. R. Meredith, Q.C., argued in support of a postponement for the prisoner, but the defence had ample time to prepare.

Dr. Andrews, stating that a copy of the evidence of Nellie Fontaine, Mary J. McCann and Mary Dwyer taken by the Police Court was not given to his solicitor with the other evidence.

Mr. Clute, Crown prosecutor, said that the case has been fully laid in the Police Court, and that the defence had ample time to prepare.

Under those circumstances Judge Street would consent to a postponement till next Monday.

Mr. Clute then said that he would throw up his brief, as he could not get ready in that time.

The grand jury are considering the case of "Dog" Andrews, who is out upon bail on a charge of being accessory after the fact.

\$500 FOR A HUSBAND'S LOSS.

Mr. York Wins Her Suit Against the City of Hamilton.

HAMILTON, Jan. 10.—The case of York v. the City of Hamilton was concluded today. It was an action brought by Mrs. Elizabeth York, widow of the late George York, who was killed on a special train west of Hamilton on the 20th of November last.
