THORNTON OFFERS TO EXPEDITE SUIT

Let Courts Decide G. T. Deben-
ture Holders' Controversy.

IS READY TO PARLEY

Assured Position Taken By Na-
tional System Sound.

MONTREAL, July 31.—In order that there might be no misunderstanding with respect to the attitude of the railroad administration in the matter of the Grand Trunk Pacific debenture stock interest, the following copy of a letter written by Sir Henry Thornton to Alfred Barnard, secretary of the Grand Trunk Pacific debenture holders committee in London, was given out for publication at Canadian National headquarters here. The letter reads: "As you are aware, the liability of the Grand Trunk Railway Company (now a part of the Canadian National Railway System) with respect to certain debenture stock issued by the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company, under the authority of chapter 100 of the statutes of Canada, 1906, has been the subject of controversy. The contention and points at issue are so well known that I need not enter into any detailed discussion of them.

"The legal department of the Canadian National Railways Company has advised me that the position taken by the company heretofore is sound.

LAY CORNER STONE NEW EAST BLOCK

Hon. G. S. Henry Officiates At Toronto Ceremony.

TORONTO, July 31.—Marking another milestone in the steady expansion of Ontario's public services, the corner stone of the new east block of the Parliament Buildings was laid yesterday afternoon by Hon. G. S. Henry, acting prime minister of the province, in the presence of a large gathering, which included several cabinet ministers and numerous members of the provincial civil service. Immediately prior to the laying of the corner stone, a box containing records of the day was deposited inside the stone by S. L. Scull, deputy minister of public works. The contents of the box consisted of current issues of Toronto daily papers, the records of the city and of the department of public works for the past year, the records of the realm and a history of the beginning and construction of the present building.

The stone was then swung into place and declared "Well and truly laid" by Mr. Henry, who used for the purpose a silver trowel presented by C. Blake Jackson, head of the firm of Jackson-Lewis & Company, to whom the contract for the construction of the new building was awarded. A short prayer was then offered by Rev. Canon Baynes-Reid.

COCKSHUTT NOT TO RE-ENTER POLITICS

"More Economy and Less Politics Canada's Need," Governor Says.

BANFF, Alta., July 31.—The A. B. C. of Canada's need to-day is less politics and more economy, an amalgamation of the Eastern, Central and Western viewpoints and a Canadian policy that will lead to a development of its industries and the obliteration of all differences between the races and religions existing in this country. This summarizes an interview here to-day with Lieut.-Governor Cockshutt, of Ontario, president of the Cockshutt Plow Company, and "baby" director of the C. P. R.

Governor Cockshutt, who is spending 10 days at Banff with his wife and two daughters, declared that he would be through with politics when he term as governor ends this year. This in spite of the fact that his name is already being mentioned by certain factions in the East as a political prospect.

"The lesson of tolerance is one of the great things that Canada must learn," said the governor.

After 10 days at Banff, Governor Cockshutt will visit Vancouver and Victoria.

DUST IS BLAMED FOR MOTOR CRASH NEAR IONA

ST. THOMAS, July 30.—Dust thrown up by a speeding car is attributed as the cause of a collision between two automobiles near Iona this afternoon. The cars were being driven by D. G. Smith, of Chatham, and W. Lloyd, of Chicago. Both machines were damaged. The occupants of the automobiles escaped injury other than a shaking up.

UNCERTAIN AS TO INJURIES EXTENT

Whether London Man Hurt Internally Is Unsettled

FIVE STILL IN HOSPITAL

Car Involved in Crash At Union Burns Some Time Later

ST. THOMAS, July 30.—Little change is reported at the Memorial Hospital in the condition of the five victims of the head-on automobile collision near Union last night, who still remain in the hospital. Of the five, Charles L. Wideman, of London, and Earl Walker, of St. Thomas, are the most seriously hurt, although now the hospital authorities are fairly certain that Mr. Walker has not been definitely injured as was at first feared. The same certainty does not exist with respect to Mr. Wideman, the full extent of whose injuries are not yet apparent.

Externally Mr. Wideman suffered a dislocated hip, fractured leg, severe lacerations of the face and painful body bruises, while it has not been definitely determined yet whether he is also injured internally. With the fear of internal injuries, the condition of Mr. Walker is not yet apparent.

Thirteen involved.

It developed to-day that there were 13 involved in the accident instead of nine, as the reports last night, received in the confusion following the accident, indicated. The four others, all youngsters, were in the car owned and

driven by William Howarth, and the failure of any of those who were on the scene of the accident to mention them was due probably to the fact that none were hurt sufficiently to require medical attention, although they suffered from shock, cuts and bruises.

They were: Frank Winoski, aged five, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Winoski, 10 Woodworth avenue; Sabilla and Wesley Schultz, aged 10 and five, respectively, children of Mr. and Mrs. Schultz, of Rochester, N.Y.; and Audrey Mann, 14-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. Mann, the latter one of the injured.

HOWARTH CAR BURNED.

Another feature of the accident brought to light to-night was the fact that about four hours after the accident Mr. Howarth's car, which was badly wrecked and was left on the roadside with Mr. Wideman's car, was almost completely destroyed by fire.

The blaze is believed to have been caused by a short circuit igniting the gasoline. The charred remains of the car were brought to a local garage to-night.

Provincial Constable Devlin and other officers visited the scene of the crash to-day to seek an explanation of the accident. In that, however, they were not completely successful as there remain a number of details which probably can be explained only by the drivers of the two machines, Messrs. Howarth and Wideman.

It is alleged that Mr. Wideman was driving on the wrong side of the road and that a charge may be laid against him.

Mr. Wideman, who is still confined to his bed in the St. Thomas Hospital, states that he was driving close to the edge of the ditch on his own side of the road when the other car, travelling at an excessive rate of speed, swung out from behind another machine and crashed into their car. Other reports state that the Wideman car was on the wrong side of the road as he came over the brow of the hill. This, though, Mr. Wideman states is not true.
