In 1857, 1858, 1859, the Chapman Medal was awarded for the best general standing; in 1860, 1861, 1862, for Classics; in 1863, for general standing and first rank honors in Moral Philosophy and Rhetoric; in 1864, for Natural Science.

In 1862, the Prince of Wales Medal was awarded for Natural Science; in 1863, for Mathematics and Physics; in 1864, for Classics.
