

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE FOR 1907.

*To the members of the Canadian
Club of Halifax:*

Gentlemen,—The Executive Committee of the Canadian Club of Halifax, in presenting their report at this, the first annual meeting of the Club, desire at the outset to make a short survey of what has been accomplished since the Club was started. On February 7th, 1907, at a meeting held in the Council Chamber, City Hall, the Club was established, and at a meeting held at the same place on February 22nd, 1907, the constitution and by-laws of the Club were adopted and the officers elected for the term ending October 28th. The first address given to the Club was by Mr. J. S. Willison, the well-known editor of *The News* of Toronto. It was delivered at the Assembly Hall of the School for the Blind, March 21st, on "Forty Years of Confederation." The other addresses were as follows:
