Our readers have for some mouths been following the steps of the Bishep of Bluemfontein in the jour nal of his adventurous travels, of which the last instalment appears in our present number. The whole of the country through which he passed was sparsely pop lated; some of it may almost be called a desert. According to all the precedents of the past it would have been long, very long, before even our national spirit of enterprise had colonised those reg ons, and we may say w.thout boasting that colonisat on is an art in which the Englishman excels beyond all compar son. But s has been sa d methods are chang ing. It is not now the poor who cun no longer bear the pressure of life at home who seek in new countries the home teads and the independence denied to them at home It is cap tal, in volume unlimited and direc ed by weal hyand shrewd con pan es or syndicates at home, which now seizes on enormous coun tries, and throws across the r area a network of railway, canals, tele-graphs, and floats other ventures for the opening of coal fields for the working of gold mines, and generally for developing all the latent capacities of the country.

lumed ately on the return of the B shop of bloemfontein to his home there was a stir in the South African Church, which in its poverty saw the duty of extend ng her fron iers at least up to the Zambesi, the northern limit of the B shops jour ney. Ways and means make the Church's action slow. Capital has no such difficulty. Every loan that is 'floated' is subscribed many times over, and money has to be rejected borause it is offered in volume greater than can be employed. Speculation is act ve and eager; risk of loss is incurred, and gladly; and so within the last few weeks a g gantio company has been founded under royal charter, which will at first occupy a reg on one third greater than Germany, which is to be known as British Zambesi. In the words

of the Times of October 22 ... The principal field of operations of the br.t sh South African Company, according to the charter, shall be the region of South Africa lying immediately to the nor h of Br.tish Be huanaland, and to the north and west of the South African Republic, the Transvaal, and to the west of the Portuguese dominions. No

western limit, it is seen, is stated; that was perhaps unnecessary, as of course it is settled that the 20th degree of east longitude marks off the widest German claims Ample room is hus left to the company for he expansion of its terr tory, and the charter expressly stipulates that it is at perfect liberty to do so by every logit mate means, east west and north. The company is authorised to acqu re whatever other concessions it can including All or any rights, interests authorities, and powers of any kind or nature whatever including powers necessary for the purpose of governmen and the preservation of publicorder in and for the protection of territories, lands, or property comprised or referred to in the concession and agreements made as aforesaid, or affecting other territories lands or property in Africa or the inhabitants thereof. In short the company is empowered to govern the territories embraced in its charter in the name and in behalf of the interests of the British Empire."

Thus in a few years this corpora tion, resembling as it does in some fea ures the old East India Company, will have occupied the country up to the borders of the Congo and Lakes Tanganyika and Nyassa. The Lake Cou panies, which are at present colonising that country are ready to be absorbed into Zumbesia. while on the north east the British Imperial East Africa Company is tending from the Victoria Nyaaza in a so th westerly direction, and will at no distant day meet the others. The influx of Englishmen and English capital into the two South African Republics will soon make those countries English in influence, language and sentiment, and there can be no reasonable doubt that England will have the dominate irg power over the whole of the continent.
