SIR.

I have the honour to refer to your note No. 46 of April 23, 1948, which reads as follows:

"Conforming to the desire of the Government of Italy and Italy ment of Canada to further extend and increase the flow of trade between their two countries, I have the pleasure to propose to Your Excellency, of behalf of the Canadian Government, the following Commercial Module Vivendi:

1. Articles, the growth, produce or manufacture of Italy shall not, of importation into Canada, be subject to higher duties or charges than those levied or which may hereafter be levied on like articles, the growth, produce or manufacture of any other foreign country.

2. The advantages now accorded, which may hereafter be accorded by Canada exclusively to other territories under the sovereignty of His Majesto the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas or under His Majesty's suzerainty, protection or mandate, shall excepted from the operation of this agreement.

3.
