NOTICE TO READERS

During the past several years, the Fisheries Division of External Affairs and International Trade Canada has worked, in conjunction with the Fisheries Council of Canada and the Canadian Association of Fish Exporters (CAFE), to increase exports of herring roe from Atlantic Canada to Japan. Joint efforts include a mission from Atlantic Canada to Japan in November 1988, the subsequent publication of a report on the mission and the staging of a series of workshops to explain the mission's findings to the industry. Copies of the mission report are available from Fisheries Division.

East coast herring roe is processed in Japan and becomes AGITSUKE KAZUNOKO, a popular snack food. In 1989, CAFE and Fisheries Division decided to cooperate in producing a study of the Japanese market for agitsuke kazunoko, with a view to providing the industry with the basis for a promotional campaign. This booklet, based on an extensive consumer survey throughout Japan carried out in 1989, is the result.
