LATIN AMERICA: GENERAL EMPLOYMENT SITUATION

Opportunities for paid employment, outside of teaching English and/or French, are limited even if the candidate is fluent in Spanish, or in Brazil, Portuguese. Occasional openings occur in the Canadian and other embassies and qualified people may find contract or other work with some of the international agencies.

All reports stress the great need for volunteer work, particularly in the fields of medicine, social services, and teaching.

ARGENTINA (Buenos Aires)

The Argentine Government and the mission are negotiating a reciprocal agreement which at present is in the draft stages. Final approval by both parties is expected within the coming months.

International agencies such as the UN, and other embassies, are not subject to Argentine employment laws.
