Mr. Howard: It does not even recognize that the world exists.

Mr. Jamieson: Your members would take eight days to do that.

Mr. Basford: I have not seen a bill yet that remade the world, but perhaps the NDP think that they have. I know that they feel they are closer to God than most.

Mr. Lewis: Which God, Ron?

Mr. Basford: But it seems to me that it should, it does and it will benefit Canadians and improve the capital market and the flow of money into the residential mortgage business in this country. Surely, in view of the present situation in the country, that bill should be supported. We are building houses in record numbers in this country, 260,000 units a year. We will need \$4 billion to \$5 billion a year in investment to maintain those targets. Surely, this kind of bill which can introduce into the residential mortgage business, I would estimate, some \$500 million almost immediately should not be turned down. Surely, we should pass this legislation to attract that money into the residential mortgage business and make that contribution toward solving the problems we have. I hope hon members will support the bill.
