

is particularly unworthy of the Government. Not only is it unworthy but it is unnecessary. The House Leader of the Liberal Party had only to count the number of Hon. Members who have spoken on Bill C-143 and he would have found that there were only a handful who had not spoken. I will let him in on a secret, Mr. Speaker. There were only about two Hon. Members on this side of the House who wished yet to speak. So in fact, what the Government has done by bringing in closure has cost them another day. What would have happened had they not brought in closure is that this debate would have ended. Second reading debate on Bill C-143 would have ended after about 20 minutes. It would have gone to committee and the work of Parliament would have been expedited, instead of being delayed as it is now. We have used this afternoon, and we will presumably use another full day on this issue, before the matter gets to committee. It is indicative, Mr. Speaker, of the Government's inability to run this House, and that is not unremarkable because we realize—
