APPLICATION FOR PROJECT FUNDING

Question No. 124—Mr. Young (Beaches—Woodbine):

Since 1984, did UNIGEC and Anthony Pau and Associates make a joint application for project funding to the Canadian International Development Agency and, if so (a) what was the title of each project (b) what was the nature of each project (c) what was the location of each project (d) what was the amount of funding requested for each project (e) what service was UNIGEC and Anthony Pau and Associates to provide to each project (f) on what date were the applications made (g) on what date were the applications approved or rejected (h) if rejected, what were the reasons given for the rejection (i) subsequent to any of the applications being made, did any person or persons make an intervention with respect to the application, and if so, what is the name of such person(s) and what was the purpose of the intervention?

UNIGEC and Anthony Pau and Associates

(a) Wind Energy Development Study, Qibei County, Yunnan Province, China.

(b) Engineering feasibility and technology options analysis.

(c) Qibei County, Yunnan Province, China.

(d) \$205,107.

(e) Project administration services and participation in the engineering study with Mr. Pau.

(f) October 9, 1987.

(g) CIDA conditional approval given October 24, 1988, with a deadline February 24, 1989 for the signing of commercial contracts with the Chinese client. Conditional approval is standard Industrial Cooperation Program (INC) practice.

(h) The two firms were unable to reach a contractual arrangement within the above time frame stipulated by CIDA. As such, it was not possible for CIDA to continue to offer support for the study.

(i) Yes. Mr. Greg Giokas, Special Assistant to the Minister for External Relations and International Development asked that CIDA issue a letter to the consortium outlining the conditions that had to be met before a contribution agreement could be signed.

Hon. Monique Landry (Minister for External Relations): Yes, two applications were received by CIDA, Industrial Cooperation Program (INC).

Anthony Pau and Associates

(a) (i) a wind energy demonstration project.¹

(ii) a Canadian Project Preparation Facility engineering study proposal.²

(b) (i) the engineering study, purchase and installation of a wind turbine.

(ii) an engineering analysis of wind conditions and technology options.

(c) both projects were located in Yunnan Province in Southwestern China.

(d) (i) \$500,000

(ii) \$99,000

(e) (i) engineering analysis, equipment purchase, equipment installation supervision and results evaluation.

(ii) engineering analysis, study of technology options.

(f) (i) discussions in late 1986.

(ii) proposal was received in CIDA on February 8, 1987.

(g) they were not approved

(h) (i) a meeting with Mr. Pau was held in late 1986 to explain to him that the CIDA Industrial Cooperation Program could not support the equipment supply and demonstration project idea since the Program had no mandate to fund equipment purchases.

(ii) the engineering study proposal was received February 8, 1987. In June 1987, CIDA wrote to Mr. Pau communicating the results of the CIDA Professional Services evaluation of the engineering study proposal and suggestions as to how it needed to be strengthened in order to be approved.
