And The House having continued to sit after 12 of the clock, midnight;

SATURDAY, 19TH MAY, 1883.

The Bill No. 111 from the Senate, intituled: "An Act to amend and consolidate the *Laws* relating to *Penitentiaries*," was considered in Committee of the Whole (the Resolution adopted on the subject, on the 7th instant, referred) amended, reported, considered as amended, and agreed to, and ordered for a third reading, *at the next sitting of The House*.

Sir *John A. Macdonald* moved, that the amendments made by the Senate to the Bill No. 45 further to amend and to consolidate as amended, the several Acts respecting the *Public Lands* of the *Dominion* therein mentioned, be now taken into consideration, and concurred in.

Mr. *Blake* moved in amendment thereto,—that this House doth disagree with the amendments as to the *Mines* and *Coal Lands Regulations*, for the reason that it is not fitting to abandon the existing measure of Parliamentary control, over such *Regulations*;—which was negatived on a division.

The said amendments were then concurred in.

The Bill No. 95 from the Senate, intituled: "An Act further to amend "*The Interpretation Act*," was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, amended, reported, considered as amended, and agreed to, read a third time, and passed.

The House then adjourned at 1 A.M., until 3 o'clock P.M., this day.
