suggested by the strong medical tradition of this University. The second would be a response to the rapidly developing interest of this country in international affairs and to the growing consciousness, in modill and in the great harbour-city where the University has its seat, of the intimate interdependence of all the civilized peoples in every aspect of their daily life. These, however, are only two examples of the unlimited peasibilities of useful activity in the domain of social science. The difficulty will be, not to find applies of investigation from among these that will element for attention as our work proceeds.
