Many Aquatic Events To Be Contested Today

The big event in aquatic circles is the ladies' race across the bay, which will be held by the Toronto Swimming Club. Already six entries have been secured, and it looks as if a few more would be made at the last minute. Miss Lyons of Montreal, who recently completed the arduous task, but was unable to come here for the race, will try conclusions with the local swimmers, including Miss Wilson, the winner of the race and holder of the Walker House trophy. Two young girls aged fifteen and thirteen years respectively, will also race. They are sisters, and are Miss Doris and Miss Sophie Eldridge. The other entrants are Mrs. Norman and Miss Parsons.

The race is open to all lady amateur swimmers, and two handsome prizes will be given, also a handsome souvenir of the event to all who finish. Providing the water is smooth, a great race should result. The race will start from the foot of York street at three o'clock sharp.

At the conclusion of the ladies' race several club events will take place at the Toronto Swimming Club. The program includes the following events: Fifty yds. breast hand; the high dive for the special prize presented by Capt. R. H. M. Lowndes. The junior events will see the following contest: 100 yds. handcap; 50 yards, breast swim, and the neat and fancy diving exhibition.

At the exhibition the Toronto Motor Boat Club. Yesterday's races were postponed and will be held today, as well as the regular program. This includes a twenty-five mile race for displacement boats, with the C. N. E. Expansion Year Trophy as the prize; a bang and go back race for all classes; a class A. handcap, and the most important one of the series will be held. This is for the C. N. E. International Trophy, and is over a thirty-five mile course. As it is a free for all race, all the local speedsters and the visiting ones entered, and the Heloise, who won it last year, will be on hand to defend her title. Unless a heavy sea mars the race these speed demons should provide enough thrills to keep a record crowd interested all afternoon.

The R. C. Y. C. has a full card of races for their sailing regatta. Division I and II will hold a cruising race to Glouct, and the Zebra, Merrimack, and other other big fellows will take in the event. The first race starts at 2:40 and the second division at 2:45. An open race for class B boats, including the Nirwana, the Swallow, and the other boats, will be held over the local course, and it promises to be one of the most keenly contested races of the year. A dinghy novice class race will be held over the bay course. The Quib, which entered and won the four races today. The sixteen foot knockouts and the sixteen foot fourteen foot dinghies will also race, and the West, Merrimack, and other boats will fight for the premier position. Class A will hold a cruise to Oakville.

The Salmi Beach Swimming Club will hold a special cruising race to Lakeside Camp for the honorary consolation prize.






