Edwards, who was recently dismissed from the service, is said to have made off with a bag of registered letters.

BOUGHT SITE FOR FACTORY BUILDING

Seven Storey Structure for Southeast Corner of Portland and Adelaide.

Altho the purchase of the property only involved \$25,000, it is learned that the deal, which was concluded yesterday, for the southeast corner of Portland and Adelaide streets, will mean the erection of a large seven-storey loft building, to cost in the neighborhood of \$100,000.

Harry Rotenburg, the purchaser, intends to start on the erection of the factory and warehouse building at once. The property was sold by H. H. Williams & Co., who held it in trust.

C. N. R. Earnings.

In yesterday's account of Canadian Northern earnings it was stated that since July 1st the gross earnings had increased \$500,400. According to the official statement this should have read \$880,400.

BISHOPS DISCUSS BROTHERHOOD WORK

Interesting Addresses Delivered by Anglican Clerics at Trinity College.

Convocation Hall of Trinity College was filled last evening by members of the Toronto branches of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew, when Rt. Rev. Dr. J. A. Richardson, bishop of Fredericton and Rt. Rev. Dr. J. C. Roper, bishop of Columbia, gave addresses relative to the work being carried on by the brotherhood and the potentiality which it possesses in the Anglican Church of Canada. That its work is widespread was evident by the fact that the dioceses of both the speakers, in widely divergent parts of the Dominion, have been greatly influenced by its activities.

Taking as his subject "The Value of the Brotherhood in the Parish," Bishop Richardson dwelt on the tremendous influence which that organization has had in fixing the inspiration and the aspirations of the man with whom it has come into contact. Its mission was declared to be apostolic, forcing the realization of the weakness of individualism and the strength of individuality. One of its primary and most important objects was to act as a means of recruiting the ranks of the clergy in Canada.

Bishop Roper in his address described the conditions of life and work in British Columbia.

PRESENT DIPLOMAS TO VET. GRADUATES

Eulogistic Addresses Mark Closing Exercises of Ontario Veterinary College.

Attended by 300 of the students and their friends, the commencement exercises of the Ontario Veterinary College were held yesterday afternoon in Convocation Hall, when eighty-one members of the graduating class were presented with their diplomas. Principal Grange in his opening remarks introduced the class, and referred in complimentary terms to the work which they had done thruout their course. He characterized the class of '12 as being of as high a standard as any of previous years. The president's address was followed by the presentation of diplomas.

President Falconer in his address spoke in eulogistic terms of the work being done by the Ontario Veterinary College, and referred in general terms to the progress which it has been making during recent years. Deputy Minister of Agriculture W. Furt Roadhouse was also present and added to the laudatory remarks of the other two speakers. The fact that before the next closing exercises were held the Veterinary College would be occupying their fine new building on University avenue was referred to by the deputy minister, who spoke of the new building as a necessity demanded by the interests of veterinary surgery in Ontario.

GAS POISONING WAS CAUSE OF DEATH.

Coroner Butt held his first inquest at the morgue last night and his jury brought in a verdict of gas poisoning in connection with the death of William Wood at his boarding house, 153 Grange avenue, on April 15. The only evidence taken was that of the members of the family with whom he resided. Mr. David Carscadden said that Wood came into the house under the influence of liquor and retired. About 2 a.m. said Miss Thelma R. Carscadden, Wood was heard roaming about his room, and at 7 o'clock the next morning he was found asphyxiated.


