

PRICES WERE FIRM ON FRUIT MARKET

Quantity Not So Large and Good Demand Held Figures Up.

PLUMS SELLING BETTER

Chief Reason Was Because of More Choice Shipments.

There was not as large a quantity of fruit on the market yesterday as there has been, and the prices were slightly firmer. There were a few small shipments of raspberries sent in which sold at 10c to 12c per box; two cases of very good ones being shipped by James Pennington of Clarkson to J. B. Bamford & Sons, realizing the highest price.

ANOTHER DECREASE IN STOCK RECEIPTS

Less Cattle, Hogs and Calves Than During Same Week Last Year.

The total receipts of live stock at the City and Union Stock Yards for the past week were: Cattle, 478; Hogs, 334; Sheep, 1083; Calves, 43; Horses, 20. The combined receipts of live stock at the two markets for the past week show an increase of 89 cars, 1622 head and 1000 head of horses, but a decrease of 191 cattle, 7 hogs and 605 calves, compared with the corresponding week of 1914.

CLOSING WAS STRONG IN IRON AND REAL MARKET

Earlier Losses in Group of Speculators Were Largely Overcome.

MONTREAL, Aug. 20.—After opening with overnight losses running from large-sized fractions to about 2 points and falling about a point lower in the early trading, local stocks developed a rallying tendency later on and by noon initial declines had been substantially reduced. In the afternoon the market went quiet and steady, with some further improvement in one or two issues. The net result of the day's movement was to leave the more active stocks with losses averaging about one point.
