EASTERN ISLES.—Ceylon, Sumatra, Java, and all the Sunda Isles; Borneo, Celebes, and Gilolo, with their adjacent Isles; the Moluccas, Magindanao, Papua, the Philippines, and many smaller Isles of the Eastern Archipelago.
