But England, that had been known as the wod-fed John Bull, was now on rations, and in the month of January people in good standing in England had been fined \$200 because a single crust of bread had been found in their ash barrel. Such an example showed how intent the British people were on winning the war and absolutely eliminating waste. The British people were now paying 39 per cent-of their incomes in war taxes, and they had already loaned vast sums of money to their allies.
