of Works Will Receive a Proposal From Cataract Co.

HAMILTON, April 28.—(Special.)-Detectives Coulter, Bleakley and Miller made a sensational arrest this evening. Two weeks ago Thomas Maizey reported that he had been assaulted and robbed of \$30. He was so badly injured that his life was despaired of. He accused William Edmonstone of having a hand in the job. Detectives got word this evening Edmonstone was driving out over the mountain with another man. The three sleuths drove out and headed the pair off. They concealed their horse and waited.
