MILK AND SCARLET FEVER.

Danger Lies in the Bottle Delivery System.

THE PROCESS OF CLEANING

Is Not Satisfactory in Many Cases, Says the Medical Health Officer.

Bottles Will Hardly Stand the Heat Necessary to Sterilization—Jubilee Matters Willing Up—Where to Go Swimming Along the Water Front—New Pavements Completed and Ordered to be Commenced—Court of Revision—City Hall Notes.

Medical Health Officer Sheard yesterday gave the world some facts about the connection that had been traced between the scarlet fever epidemic and the milk supply. The doctor says that by careful investigation he found that the dairy that afterwards ordered to be closed was supplying milk to quite a number of families in which scarlet fever had broken out.

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THE LATE REV. JOHN BURTON.

Funeral Services Yesterday at Both Gravenhurst and in Toronto—Great Tributes of Respect.

The remains of the late Rev. John Burton, M. A. B. D., who died at Gravenhurst on Tuesday, were brought to this city on the Muskoka Express last evening, accompanied by James G. Thompson, son-in-law of the deceased, and Mr. A. P. Cockburn, who is an elder in the church at Gravenhurst where the deceased officiated.

Every mark of respect that could be accorded a loved pastor and revered citizen was extended toward the deceased. At very large number of residents accompanied the remains from the train to the church where the service was conducted by the members of the Gravenhurst congregation, taking part being Rev. Dr. Clark, Bruce Grant, Orville, Rev. Mr. Noble and Rev. Mr. Moody. The service was a very affecting one, the life and work of the deceased being feelingly referred to by his brother ministers. During the service the funeral cortege to and from the church the blinds being all drawn, a general weeping sorrow at the loss of a good citizen being apparent.

Upon the arrival of the remains at the Union Station, Toronto, they were met by a large number of friends and conveyed to the residence of Mr. F. J. Thompson, 117 Park-road, where services were conducted by Rev. Dr. Greig, assisted by Rev. Dr. Thomas and Rev. Dr. Parker, after which the remains were conveyed to their final resting place in Mount Pleasant cemetery. Rev. Dr. Greig conducting the last and rites.

NEW ROADWAY BRIDGE

Over the Winnipeg River Between Rat Portage and Keewatin—Great Government Contribution.

Henry Smith, the Provincial Superintendent of Colonization Roads, leaves to-day to inspect the construction of the new iron bridge over the Winnipeg River and along the road between Rat Portage and Keewatin. The new bridge supersedes the wooden structure erected by the Ontario Government when the country was first opened up. It will be probably the longest roadway bridge in the province, having a 222 foot span and crossing the river where the water current averages a depth of 55 feet.

The bridge is being constructed by the Crowe Brothers & Engineering Company, the Crown Lands Department devoting the sum of \$2140 to it in the estimate. The local municipalities bear the remaining expense. It is expected that the works will be completed in about a month.

STOLEN FROM THE WAGON.

Disappearance of a Valuable Sealskin. A Sealman's Wagon Stolen.

A \$250 sealskin sledge disappeared from a Canadian Express Company wagon last Saturday. When the Wild West show was at Quebec one of the ladies connected with it ordered a sealskin sledge from G. L. Kenyon & Co. The garment was to be made in Quebec and tried on by the lady at Toronto. The coat reached Toronto on a Canadian Express and was placed in the trunk of a wagon for delivery to the lady. The driver had to call at the Pure Gold Works on Front-street and he noticed that the package was then in his wagon. He went directly to the Pure Gold Works, a drive of only two or three minutes, but when he arrived at the latter place the parcel had disappeared.

The driver of the wagon was arrested and the sealskin sledge was recovered. The driver was fined \$100 and costs.
