THIS ORDER IS SIGNIFICANT.
Transports to be held in Reserve for the Immediate Despatch of British Troops.

SALISBURY AND CHAMBERLAIN
Will Go Ahead With Their Warlike Policy Now That Parliament Is Out of the Way.

London, Aug. 10.—The *Standard* and other afternoon papers say the British administration for transport purposes have been notified to hold all their transports in reserve for the immediate despatch of troops. The *Standard* says that the transport of troops is a subject of the highest importance to the British government.

BOERS WANT A FIGHT.
That is what lobbyists are saying in the British House of Commons—bitterly feeling.

Buffalo, Aug. 10.—A cable dispatch to The Evening News from London says that the one subject which is becoming more and more prominent in the House of Commons is the question of the Boers. It is recognized that the Government has a free hand now that Parliament is prorogued, and that Lord Salisbury and Mr. Chamberlain were only waiting for a chance of Parliamentary restraint before launching into a war of policy. The House of Commons was not surprised at Mr. Chamberlain's frank suggestion yesterday that the Government was ready for an appeal to the people. If the Boers refuse to accept his proposals as a joint enquiry into the franchise question.

Boers Looking for Fight.
In the lobby after the session had closed, the balance of opinion was that the Boers were counting a conflict and that Kruger would not be contented with the status quo.

Outlanders Getting Away.
A telegram from Johannesburg says that the Boers are moving their families to the Transvaal in such numbers that yesterday's census shows that there are more Boers than the railway could cope with.

The Forces in Natal.
There are only 4,000 British troops in Natal, and these are gradually being moved to Newcastle. It is not thought, however, that the Boers will attempt to invade the colony. The great capabilities of England's army in the Transvaal would enable her to pour twenty thousand soldiers into the Boer's country within three weeks.
