



A semi-official explanation of these move-ments comes to-day from St. Petersburg to the effect that they were merely to test the capacity of the Central Asian railroads to transport troops. The experiment, it is added, is regarded as highly successful, as it proves that in case of necessity, troops from the Caucasus can reach Kushka in eight days. The above explanation is hardly regarded as entirely satisfactory, but official circles discredit the idea that Russia's present novements in any way threaten Afghani-stan or India.
