The conference of the Church of England in Canada was held in the Church of the Ascension, the Bishop of Toronto presiding. The devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. T. R. O'Meara and Canon Sweeney. A statement was presented of the progress of the mission work in Canada since the Dominion Foreign Mission Board was organized fifteen years ago.
