Squall Struck Challenger While Pre-

paring to Race, Injuring Sir

Thomas Lipton.

CAPT. WRINGE'S RELATIVE DROWNED

Wormouth, April 17.—Sir Thomas Lipton's

new challenger for the America's Cup,

Shamrock II., was dismantled in a squall

to-day shortly after leaving this harbor pre-

paring to another race with Sham-

rock I. Her mast, as it fell over the side,

drowned and several persons, including Sir

way, were bruised or otherwise injured.
