SITUATION IN WEST TORONTO IS SERIOUS

Another Case of Smallpox Developed Last Night—Wholesale Vaccination.

WEST TORONTO, Feb. 24.—The list of smallpox patients from West Toronto at the Swiss Cottage Hospital is steadily growing. The very latest victim is George Wilson, who rooms at 12 Mulock-avenue. Symptoms of the disease were recognized on him about 5 o'clock to-night by Dr. Gilmour, and a few hours later he was sent to the Swiss Cottage. For the past few weeks Wilson has been acting as guard at 2 May-street, where Oscar Johnson's family were quarantined, and a few days ago, when Mrs. Johnson and child were sent to the hospital, Wilson was transferred to the guardship of 33 Eglinton-street, where the Copeland family are isolated. The house on Mulock-avenue, where he resided, has been put under quarantine. There are five occupants here.

Were All Vaccinated. Every employe of Helmtzman's piano factory in this city was vaccinated today, as a result of George Barnes, 39 Hook-avenue, who works in the finishing department of the factory, having contracted smallpox. Mayor Baird, Dr. Gilmour, M.E.O., and J. J. Smyth, chairman of the Health Board, were present at the meeting this morning, and decided that the entire factory force, numbering 350, should be vaccinated. Several of the men objected to being vaccinated, and as a result, will be kept in quarantine at their homes. The officials of the Helmtzman Company were consulted by the medical health department, and agreed to have Barnes' fellow-employe removed. The whole finishing department was then vaccinated.

According to the statement issued this morning by R. J. Leigh, city assessor, the land in West Toronto is assessed at \$2,172,545, and the improvements at \$3,758,325. The total assessment totals \$4,930,870, and that of income \$97,305. This is an increase of \$54,000 over the previous year. The report also states that the number of persons from 0 to 21 years is 31,667; from 21 to 60 years, 82,555. The latter are eligible to serve as Jurors. These figures show the total population of West Toronto, which differs considerably from the recent police census of over 12,000. The executive committee of the council meet to-morrow evening.

NORTH TORONTO

Dr. Amyot Says Water is Pure—Engineers Outline Scope of Work. NORTH TORONTO, Feb. 24.—A court of revision was held last night, dealing with two local improvements, a 6-inch water main on Bathurst-st. and a concrete sidewalk on Brownlow-avenue. The frontage measurements and assessments were in both cases confirmed.

At the finance committee meeting a report was received from Dr. Amyot, provincial bacteriologist, stating that the sample of water from St. Aidian's Church in the medical health officer, Dr. Jeffs, shows considerable chemical pollution, probably from seepage from the surface. It is doubtful, he says, not infested with bacteria.

A letter received from the secretary of the Ratepayers' Association will read. The letter contains a resolution passed at a public meeting, asking that immediate action be taken to secure a Sunday car service to town.

Submit Verbal Offer. Messrs. Macaulay and Murray, C.E., submitted in writing a report and estimate of the sewerage and sewage disposal as follows:

1. To examine into and report on the possibility of connecting and discharging the sewage with the city system.

2. Also, to report as to how best the town can be provided with a system of main sewers to meet present and future requirements.

3. To examine the district of North Toronto with a view to reporting as to the best system of disposing of the sewage in that district.

4. To estimate and report upon the cost and advice as to which of the methods they consider best.

In case the sewerage is retained as a consulting engineer for part or whole of the work, their fee would be five per cent. of the total cost of such work, otherwise the report and estimate would cost \$50.

Recommend Strath Road. The parallel roads committee also had a session and came to the conclusion that they would recommend that the straight road proposition be adopted as recommended by last year's committee. In regard to the parallel road east of Yonge-st., however, the committee is not a unit yet as to the opening of a parallel road west of Yonge-st. at the present time, and simultaneously with the one on the east side.

MOUNT DENNIS. Subscribers Are Up in Arms Against Sneak Dog Poisoner.

MOUNT DENNIS, Feb. 24.—(Special.)—Dog poisoners are at work around Mount Dennis and are going over the district, as they did some time ago in

Weston. A dozen dogs have already been poisoned in the last ten days, some of them valuable and including several colliers. One exceptionally valuable dog was an English field spaniel. There is much indignation among dog owners, who generally prize their pets very highly.
