

COUNTLESS AT 5 TO 1 WINS HURON HANDICAP

Hampton Court, 20 to 1, is Second and Martinez, Favorite, Third in Feature at Saratoga.

SARATOGA, Aug. 23.—Countless, well ridden by Koerner, and held at 5 to 1 in the betting, won the Huron Handicap by a head on the post to-day. Martinez, the favorite, was beaten thru Davis' handling in sending him out to make the pace. He led in the start to the final furling, when Countless came up fast and standing the long drive gamely, won by a head from Hampton Court, with Martinez third.
