TAXICABS LOSE **PARKING RIGHTS**

Many Complaints Against Noises Caused by Them in Scott and Victoria Sts.

TERAULAY EXTENSION

Because of squabbles between the various taxicab interests that have been using Scott and Victoria streets for parking purposes, the works committee yesterday decided so recommend that parking privileges on these streets be canceled. The King Edward Hotel had been granted three taxi stands on Victoria street, adjoining their own property, and they endeavored to reserve these stands for the "Yellow" cars, in which concern the hotel has an interest, but the independent taxi men crowded in repeatedly and managed to get a big share of the business from the hotel. Manager O'Neill of the King Edward told the committee yesterday that if the police would not give him unmolested use of three stands he would prefer that all taxicabs were debarred from parking in Victoria and Scott istreets.

communications from business men on Scott street were also laid before the committee, complaining about the hub-bub that is kept up on the street by the taxicabs. The result was that the committee voted unanimously to candel the parking privileges.
