FINANCIAL and COMMERCIAL

COTTON LETTER.

New York, June 18.—The market closed very close to the best last night, being helped in the last few minutes by a reported break in the Red River levee at Alexandria, La., and a little covering. Aside from spot conditions small supplies available for delivery on contract and the purely technical position of near months, there seems to be little that is bullish in the situation. If new crop months were considered cheap under present trade conditions and if there were no good outlook for a boom in the autumn as the bulls contend, it is not unreasonable to suppose that there would now be a hedge demand for new crop months as a hedge against future requirements, but so far we have seen no such demand and while crops in this country color the idea that general trade will improve this autumn, the fact that mills have gone on full time before their orders necessitated such a step and that they are accumulating stocks may serve to offset an improvement in orders during the autumn. Trade conditions abroad are very unfavorable, particularly in Germany, and while conservatism suggests a scalping condition on the market rather than aggressive operations on the bear side, caution should be observed in buying on a scale up under the circumstances.

DETAILED STOCK GOSSIP.

Detailed Stock Gossip.—Our reports are still favorable to So. Pac., Un. Pac., Nor. Pac., Amal. and Reading. They are all destined for higher prices. Reports of a drive at Smelting shorts are noted. The same may be said of Steel, on which bull tips are beginning to circulate. Leach, L. & N. S. P. Steels and others where div. cuts are probable, may be reactionary but we are disinclined to take the short side when so many good bull propositions present themselves with greater safety. Boston is buying Anaconda and Utah Copper, Atch. and Penna. are well bought. The same may be said of Great Northern. A shortage is trying to retire in St. Paul.

BULL MARKET PROBABLE.

Bullish operations seem likely in the stock market today. On reasonable buying daily operators who followed our suggestions to buy yesterday on heaviness should not neglect part profits. Purchases on little recessions thereafter are advisable. The present manipulative plan

contemplates a period of moderate improvement, according to our information. News reports this morning are favorable. Summed up, there was "a Roosevelt demonstration, a supreme renunciation, a Taft nomination and a satisfactory platform." This position is evidently based on the assumption that Taft will give a conservative administration, his election being inferred because of the popularity of the sponsorship combined with a conservatism of the delegate and platform summed up this morning.

BANK STATEMENT OUTLOOK.

The bank statement outlook is somewhat mixed by the latest monetary developments, but it is not an important factor with money cheap and the accumulation of funds for July disbursements likely to make it still cheaper before the end of the month. Earnings will pick up toward Aug. generally and after the reductions necessary during the summer, we need anticipate no more cutting. Reports on the crops should receive attention more than present earnings for the present is known and speculative and most of the good stocks in the railroad department have discounted possible cutting of rates. We continue to suggest the advisability of maintaining the conservative bull position on the standard stocks.
