LAWYERS IN THE UNITED STATES .- Mr

Lawyers in the United States.—Mr. Livingston, the editor of the Monthly Law Magazine, of this city, has just published, in a volume of letween two and three hundred pages, a complete register of all the lawyers in the United States, and their post-office address. The number in the aggregate is twenty-one thousand sine hundred and seventy-nine, or about one to every litteen hundred inhabitants, male and female, old and young black and white, Jew and Gentile, bond and free; not a very large number of sharks after all for the number of shad.

It is difficult to say what is the tax which the property of the nation pays to lawyers, but some approximation may be reached, by estimating the number now in practice at 20,000, (that being a deduction of 979 from Mr. Livingston's list, to cover the retired members of the profession,) and by estimating each lawyer in practice to average an annual income of \$1000. This would make the aggregate cost of legal services in the United States twenty-one million of dollars a year, or an equivalent to the interest, at six per cent., on two thousand millions of dollars. Mr. Livingston estimates the average income of each practising lawyer in the United States at \$1500, which we think quite too high. Out of the large cities, the moome of lawyers, in full practice, will not average a thousand dollars a year. New York Evening Post.
