

THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Board of Home Missions.

The Board, in presenting their Third Report, would call attention to the fact that the depression in monetary matters has been more severely felt than in the preceding years, more especially amongst the fishermen. In many localities the destitution is really deplorable, and your Missionaries in those Parishes have had to suffer to a degree inconceivable to residents in the cities, yet they have worked on uncomplainingly and patiently, earnestly and faithfully doing their Master's work, looking and trusting for the only rewards worth working for, viz., the "well done" of the Master. And although your Board was compelled to reduce the grants of most of the Missions, knowing that the Parishes could not make up the deficiency, yet in only one case has there been a remonstrance sent in to the Board; and in most cases, the subscriptions in 1879 have been in excess of previous years, and a comparison of the subscription lists for 1877, 1878, and 1879 shows a favorable result, viz:—
