




Special to The Times-Star REDERICTON, Nov. 1.-The increase in the number of portable saw mills put in the New Brunswick woods for operation near the scene of the logging, is an outstanding feature of the woods season which is now well opened. A. T. Mur-chie, chief scaler of the Department of Lands and Mines, has returned from a tour which included Chipman, Newcastle and Bathurst, and which gave a good idea of the extent of operations during this season. Mr. Murchie learned that curtailment was the order of the day on the

north shore, but that in the central, and southern portions of the province, operations were about on the scale of last season. Albert county, in fact, may cut slightly more logs than before.

LARGER MILL DISPLACED

The small portable mill as has been forecasted for some years past is taking the place of the large stationary mill, the mill being taken to the timber berth instead of the logs taken to the mill as in past years. Decrease in the size of the logs cut and increased distance for stream driving are given as the chief reason for the change. A short haul to a shipping point on a railway is an essential for the operation of the portable mill.
