### ST. STEPHEN'S WIN

### CADET COMPETITION

As a result of the inspection of the St. Stephen's and St. Andrews Cadet Corps last evening by Lieut-Col. A. B. Snow the former corps was adjudged the winner for the province, defeating Victoria School of Moncton by the narrow margin of ten points, and then only on a technicality. This makes the St. Stephen's corps the winner of the province, donated by Brigadier Gen. H. H. McLean four years ago. Winning it to consecutive years gives possession. If St. Andrews had won the cup this year it would have been theirs to keep. Only public school corps are eligible for competition for the Lord Strathcona cup. This eliminates St. Stephen's, St. Andrews, and Rethers Collegiate school, which corps will be inspected today.
