Daily Hints For the Cook

Jenny Lind Cakes.
One-half cup sugar, 2 1/2 flour, 3 teaspoons of cream of tartar, add 1 egg without beating, 1 cup milk, 1 tablespoonful butter, 1 teaspoonful of soda. Beat together sugar, flour, cream of tartar, egg and milk. Melt butter by pouring in hot water in which soda has been dissolved. Beat up the whole ingredients together well and bake in muffin tins.

Chicken a La Hollandaise.
Take out the breast bone of a large young fowl and fill up the space with a nice force meat. Make a batter as for fritters and when the fowl is half roasted pour the batter over it, let dry and then pour on more until it is thickly coated and a rich brown in color. Remove from pan, cut up as for a fricassee, place on platter, lay corn fritters around the edge of dish, scatter some sprigs of parsley over, and serve at once with melted butter and lemon quarters. Oyster force meat is nice.

GETS \$42 VERDICT FOR HIS POTATOES

Jury at Caribou Decided G. W. Savage of Fort Fairfield Did Not Ship Good Ones

Caribou, Feb. 13—One of the most interesting cases to be tried at this term of the supreme court was that of Clarence E. Van Sichen, a potato dealer of New York, against George W. Savage of Fort Fairfield. The plaintiff says that he purchased from the defendant 325 barrels of first-class Irish Cobbler potatoes for his seed trade in Long Island and that by reason of the defendant shipping him potatoes of poor quality, which he could not dispose of to his customers he suffered a loss of about \$800.

The jury arrived at a verdict for the plaintiff, awarding him damages amounting to \$442.

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES AS AIDS TO MARKETING

Washington, Feb. 13—A bill designed to stop millions of dollars of waste in poultry and eggs and other farm products by establishing marketing departments in the agricultural colleges in the various states has been introduced by Representative Jacobway of Arkansas. The measure has the approval of Assistant Secretary Galloway of the department of agriculture and Chairman Lever of the house committee on agriculture.

Each year there is produced in the United States more than \$1,000,000,000 worth of poultry and eggs," said Representative Jacobway. "Of this amount 10 per cent. is lost, 30 per cent. additional deteriorates between the original point and the retailer and the consumer and there is a waste altogether of \$600,000,000. This is true of every other product of the farms. This bill would save all this loss."


