who, themselves model men, will shape after their own character the mass of their fellow-men and be their standard bearers before the country in all movements for truth and moral goodness.

Now these men are moulded in the matrix of catholic education. If men of this stamp do not come forth from Catholic colleges, then our institutions have failed in their ration d'être. A glance at the pages of history tells us all that such education has procured for the world, and its consequent advantages for us.

It is the educated mind that in all ages has uplifted humanity above sordid aims, raised it to a pure and ennobling sphere and prompted its highest ambitions by holding before it grand ideals.

Education brings us in contact with the great minds of every age and teaches us how to value their sterling qualities, while avoiding their errors. It engenders respect for the opinion of others and a wise tolerance of different views when no sacrifice of duty or principle is involved. Finally and chiefly all true education is founded and grounded upon the immortal ethics of the ten commandments. Consequently, while instructing us in literature, science and art it insists that we be honest and honorable, frugal and industrious, that we dread a stain upon our conscience more than a stain upon our garments and that while cultivating to the utmost the purity of language we must be far more afraid of uttering an untruth than of perpetrating a selection of wronging our neighbor in person, property, or character than of failing to achieve the highest standard in any science.

Let every faculty of the mind and every power of the body be cultivated and developed to the utmost. "Let our souls be flooded with beauty transfer our ideals to the cold hard marble; let our minds rival the æsthetic spirits in breadth and depth and perpetration and imitate loveliness." For whatever gifts make our souls resplendent have come to us from the bountiful hand of our beneficent Creator and should flow to him as the "rivers to the sea." God wishes us to use every gift of intellect within our view for his glory our own benefit and the good of our fellow-creatures. But whatever we learn or teach or do on the basis, the substance and the crown of our lives must be in obedience to the laws of Him who created us. At one time, little learning entered into the people's curriculum. Yet if the ten commandments were studied and practised the youth in the school were chaste and
