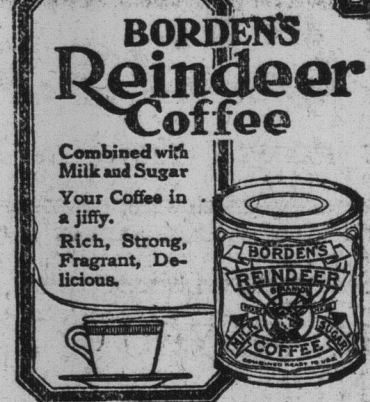

CHILDREN LOSE LIVES WHEN GREY NUNNERY BURNS

A fire broke out in the Grey Nunnery in Montreal last night and at least thirty children were burned to death. The top story of the west wing, where the children were sleeping was completely destroyed and the loss of life is appalling. The fire is thought to have started near the lower front electric wing. The flames spread so rapidly that firemen and soldiers engaged in rescue work were driven from the building and as a result many little ones were left behind to perish in the conflagration. After two hours hard work the firemen got the blaze under control and thirty-eight charred bodies were removed from the building. It is feared that many more lost their lives in the awful holocaust.

The lower part of the west wing was occupied by returned sick or wounded soldiers. Many of these did heroic work in rescuing little ones and as a result of their efforts many lives were saved. The ages of the inmates of the nunnery ranged from two days up to a hundred years. The elderly inmates were in another section of the building. Many were carried out in cots and taken to houses nearby. Ambulances, police and hospital, and many private conveyances were rushed to the scene and assisted in the work of rescue. It is feared many of the elderly inmates will die from shock.

District Fire Chief Martin said that as many children as possible were saved. He said the firemen had difficulty in preventing soldiers and the sisters from rushing into the flames in a frantic effort to save the little tots, which would have meant certain death for them. Three of the nuns fell unconscious in the smoke filled dormitory while attempting to rescue more children and had to be carried out by the firemen.

SHIPPING LOSSES.

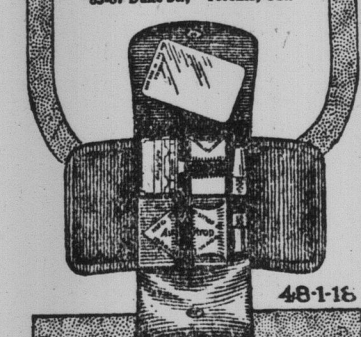

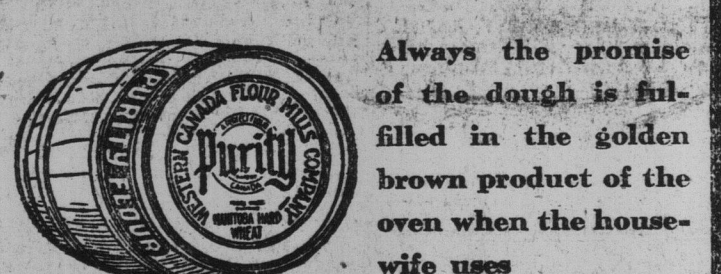

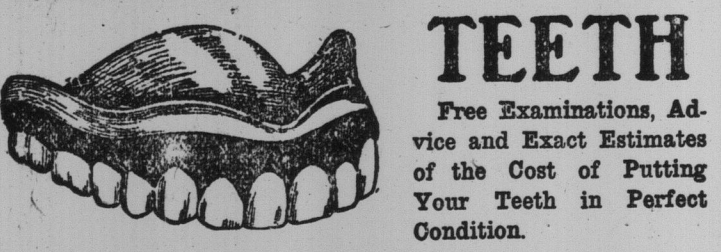
