

MAGNATES SUE THEIR "DUMMY"

Stenographer Who Was Figure-head in \$2,000,000 Deal Kept \$100,000 for His Services and Employers Want It Returned.

New York, April 8.—A twenty-five dollar a week stenographer, who acted as a "dummy," it is alleged, for Anthony N. Brady and the late Alden M. Young, in financing a \$2,000,000 rehabilitation of the Dayton, Ohio, Power & Lighting Company, is defendant in a suit brought today by Brady and Thomas F. Wood, Jr., as assignees of Young, to get possession of securities worth \$100,000 that remained after the deal was concluded.


The stenographer, Joseph P. Kelley, figured that his employers stood to make a million dollars in the transaction and decided that his services were worth more than \$25 a week. Brady and Young thought otherwise, and Kelley quit his job, taking the securities with him. The plaintiffs allege that he already has hypothecated bonds worth \$25,000 and asks for accounting and an injunction to tie up the remaining securities.

Kelley declares that he was the actual contractor in the deal and Brady and Young have no documentary evidence to prove he was a dummy.

SMASHER RELEASED FROM BRITISH JAIL

Girl Smuggled Away by Her Mother Much to the Disgust of Suffragettes

London, April 8.—Miss Zelle Emerson, a suffragette of Jackson (Mich.), was released from Holloway jail at 9 o'clock. She was taken by her mother to a nursing home, where she will be given medical treatment. Mrs. Emerson feels grave anxiety for her daughter's condition, and will not permit her to see anyone.

Certain of the more militant friends of Miss Emerson, including a number of Americans, who were displeased at Mrs. Emerson's abandoning the campaign to force the intervention of the American embassy, planned to take away the daughter without her mother's knowledge, in an automobile, so that they might get an interview with the militants placed a relay of pickets to watch Miss Emerson's release, but they were forestalled by her unexpectedly early release, the home secretary having announced that she would be set at liberty tomorrow.

Mrs. Emerson had been informed of the date of her daughter's release by the American embassy, and was on hand at the appointed time. She took her daughter immediately to a hospital, where physicians isolated her.

IMPROVE WORKERS' CONDITIONS

Norwegian Premier Outlines Extensive Programme of Activities

Christiania, Norway, April 9.—Premier Knudsen, in his ministerial statement in the Storting, declared that it was the intention of the cabinet to follow a national and democratic policy, in accordance with the programme which carried the Left to victory in the recent election. Special attention would be devoted, he said, to the economic progress of the nation. The foreign service would be reorganized to make more intimate the co-operation between the consular and diplomatic representatives.

A new government department to deal with social reform was to be created, and a special department for trade and industry. The government desired to stem by legislation the

tremendous influx of foreign capital into Norway. An old age pension law, embracing the whole population, would be laid before the Storting, and the sickness and accident insurance laws extended, so as to include fishermen. Maternity benefit would also be introduced. The existing factory legislation was to be revised in order to reduce the hours of work of women and children and those of night workers and to introduce a legal maximum working day, while other measures would regulate home work and abolish sweating. A bill for compulsory arbitration in industrial disputes was also to be introduced.

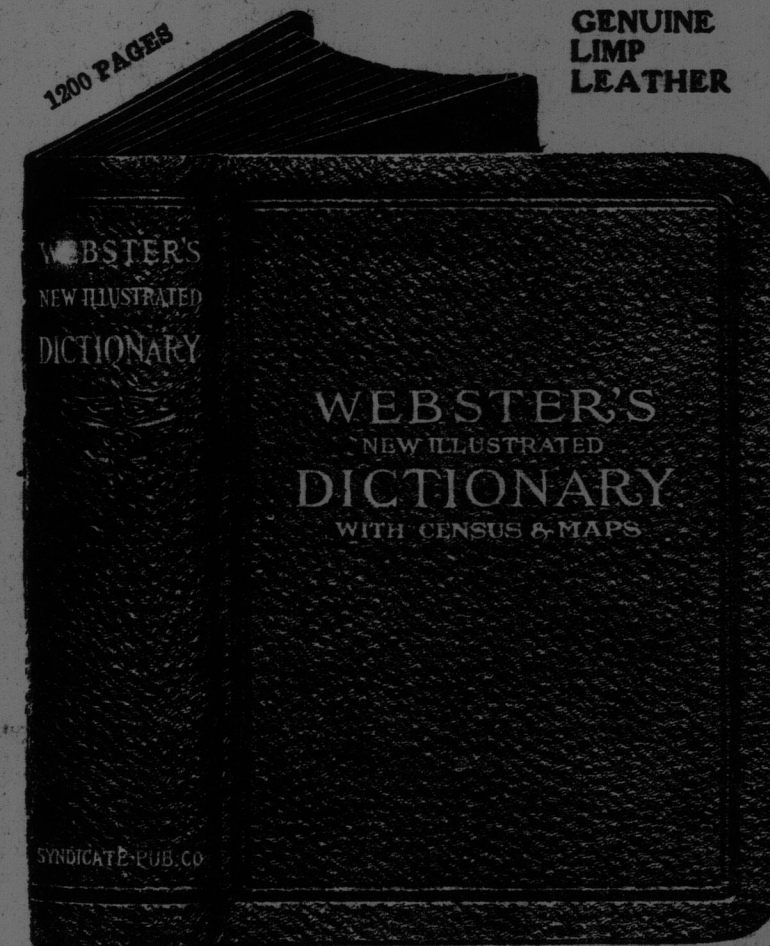
