PHILADELIPHIA, Jan. 11.—Increased rioting and charges of police brutality made by the striking shirt waist makers and their suffragette allies, marked the progress of the strike today in this city. Altercations between girls doing picket duty and workers were numerous. More than a score of arrests were made by the police, and on two occasions it was necessary to call out the reserve squad from City Hall. Among those arrested was Oscar Dornebloome, the local strike leader, who was taken into custody while escorting Miss Eleanor S. F. Pue, a prominent young society woman investigating strike conditions. She declared the manner of his arrest was an outrage.
