# ALLIANCE OF FRANCE AND GREAT BRITAIN REGARDED AS AMONG POSSIBILITIES

Looked Upon as Only Means of Keeping the Entente Intact
—British Delegates on Eve of Opening of Allied Supreme Council Meeting, Reticent Regarding Such An
Alliance—Briand in Favor of Such a Union.

Cannes, Jan. 4-With the air full of talk of an alliance etween France and Great Britain, as the only means of seping the entente intact, Premier Briand and Prime Minister Lloyd George today resumed their conversations which

ere begun some days ago in London.

British Reticent
General reticience is being observed by the principals of the British delegation on the eve of the opening of the Alied Supreme Council meeting regarding such an alliance. Premier Briand said, before going to the British Prime Minister's villa this afternoon, that it might be putting it rather strongly to talk of a formal alliance. Yet, he said, the policy of France all long has been to strengthen her ties with her war allies, since this seemed sesential to a settlement of European problems.

Members of both the French and British delegations are agreed that the stuation is grave, and that the entente powers must come closer together or they will drift more widely apart. The difference of opinion appears to center around the question of who ought to make the concessions necessary to bring about closer accord. The atmosphere throughout the day was generally pessimistic. Premier Bonomi, of Italy, arrived on the scene late this afternoon and he expected to see Premier Briand and Lloyd George during the evening.

Dublin, Jan. 4—The Sinn Fein publicity department, immediately after adjournment of the Dail Eireann late this afternoon, issued a long manifesto to the Irish people in the name of Eamonn De Valera, accompanied by his alternative proposals to replace the Anglo-Irish treaty, now being considered by the Dail. Mr. De Valera, in the manifesto, urges that there is opportunity for general reconciliations between Ireland and Great Britain, and asks the Irish people to save reconciliation from being lost through the "shortsighted expediency of politicians."
