Two drifl holes have been put down and a third is on the way. The first hole showed a width of 18 feet and the second 35 feet of mineralized rock. Both these results were made at a comparality shallow depth. The third hole is expected to go deeper and cut the vein in depth. There is good prospect of a commercial ore body being indicated by this work.
