R. W. Charles A. Welch was unanimously elected Grand Master and R. W. Charles H. Titus Grand Secretary.

A stated Communication was held at Masonic Temple, Boston, Dec. 27, for the purpose of duly celebrating the Feast of Saint John the Evangelist, and of installing the Grand officers elect, which in Massachusetts is always done on that day.

We are pleased to see from the Report before us that the Installation was surrounded by an air of decorum, propriety and solemnity becoming so important an occasion; and that the ceremonies were not performed in that hurried and slip-shod manner sometimes witnessed in other places.

The Golden Urn containing a lock of Washington's hair was then presented to the newly installed Grand Master (a custom observed at every installation since 1801)—with the following charge:

"This sacred relic, which I received from my predecessor in 1874, I now place in your han's, and I charge you to religiously preserve it, and, when your Grand-Mastership terminates, to deliver it to your successor with a charge similar to that with which you now receive it."

The Recording Secretary acknowledges the receipt of the Proceedings of sixty Grand Lodges, Nova Scotia among the number.
