

32. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and one thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Lachine Canal—Enlargement, \$25,000 ; To pay judgment of Supreme Court in St. Louis *vs.* The Crown, \$76,500, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

33. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Eleven thousand two hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Rideau Canal—William Davis & Son's final estimate and interest, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

34. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Rapide Plat Canal—Enlargement, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

The First Resolution, being read a second time, was agreed to.

The Second Resolution, being read the second time, and the Question being proposed, That this House doth agree with the Committee in the said Resolution ;

And a Debate arising thereupon ;

On motion of Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, seconded by Mr. Montague.

Ordered, That the Debate be adjourned.

Then the subsequent Resolutions, being read a second time, were agreed to.

On motion of Mr. Laurier, seconded by Mr. Davies.
