Trustees to be a Corporation.

X. And be it eracted, That the Trustees in each school section shall be a Corporation, under the name of "the Trustees of School 2

Proviso: such Corporation not to cease for want of Trustees. Mode of electing new Trustees, if necessary.

Section number in the Township of ": Provided in the County of always, that no such Corporation of any school section shall cease by reason of the want of Trustees, but in case of such want any two resident householders of such section shall have authority, by giving six days' notice, to be posted in at least three public places in such section, to call a meeting of the resident householders, who shall proceed to elect three Trustees in the manner prescribed in the fifth section of 10 this Act, and the Trustees thus elected shall hold and retire from office in the manner prescribed for Trustees elected under the 12 authority of the said fifth section of this Act.

Mode of deciding on the site of a school-house.

XI. And be it enacted, That in any case of difference as to the 14 site of a school-house between the majority of the Trustees of a school section and a majority of the resident householders at a special 16 meeting called for that purpose, each party shall choose one person as arbitrator, and the two arbitrators thus chosen, and the local Superin- 18 tendent or any person appointed by him to act on his behalf, in case of his inability to attend, or a majority of them, shall finally decide on 20 the matter.

Duties of Trustees.

XII. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Trustees 22 of each school section:

To appoint a Secretarytreasurer: his duties.

Firstly. To appoint one of themselves, or some other person, to be 24 Secretary-treasurer to the Corporation; and it shall be the duty of such Secretary-treasurer to give such security for the correct and safe 26 keeping and forthcoming (when called for) of the papers and moneys belonging to the Corporation as may be required by a majority of the 28 Trustees; to keep a record of all their proceedings in a book procured for that purpose; to receive and account for all school 30 moneys collected by rate bill or subscription from the inhabitants of such school section; to disburse such moneys in such manner as may 32 be directed by the majority of the Trustees.

To appoint a Collector: his duties.

His remuneration.

Collector to give security. Collector's powers.

Secondly. To appoint, if they shall think it expedient, a Collector 34 (who may also be Secretary-treasurer), to collect the rates they have imposed or shall impose upon the inhabitants of their school section, 36 or which the said inhabitants may have subscribed; and to pay to such Collector at the rate of not less than five or more than ten per cent., 38 on the moneys collected by him for his trouble in collecting; and every Collector shall give such security as may be satisfactory to the 40 Trustees, and shall have the same powers, by virtue of a warrant signed by a majority of the Trustees, in collecting the school rate or 42 subscription, and shall proceed in the same manner as ordinary Collectors of County and Township rates or assessments. 44

Trustees to have the possession and safe keeping of all the common school property in their section.

Thirdly. To take possession and have the custody and safe. keeping of all Common School property, which may have been acquired 46 or given for Common School purposes in such section, and to acquire and hold as a Corporation by any title whatsoever, any land, moveable 48 property, moneys or income for Common School purposes, until the
