Parsley & Lantier were walking at the right side of the road & I was on the left. We were not involved in any fight whatsoever from the time we left the truck until we came in contact with an English soldier & an A.T.S. girl.

Cross Exam:

We got off the truck about a mile from camp. I didn't see Pte Davidson, the last witness, at all that night. I heard his evidence. Lantier, Parsley & I were alone after the A.T.S. girl. Pte Lantier came with us.

By the Court:- Davidson's evidence is not true. We did not get into any fracas from the time we left the dance hall, except the one which is the subject of the third charge.
