

23. The Cabinet noted the report of the Secretary of State for External Affairs that Mr. F.H. Larson and General G.R. Pearkes had been appointed as the Liberal and Conservative Parliamentary advisers to the Canadian delegation to the forthcoming United Nations General Assembly and that it was not planned to appoint a C.C.F. or Social Credit adviser for the present.

Canadian Legion; interview with the government

24. The Minister of Veterans Affairs said the President of the Canadian Legion had enquired whether the Executive Council of the Legion could, as usual, meet with members of the government shortly before Remembrance Day.

25. The Cabinet, after discussion, noted the report of the Minister of Veterans Affairs and agreed to receive the Executive Council of the Canadian Legion at 11:30 a.m. on November 9th, 1951.

Parliament; hours for sittings

26. The Prime Minister raised the question of arrangements to be adopted for sittings of the House of Commons after the present week.

27. The Cabinet, after discussion, agreed that the Minister of Public Works and the Minister of Citizenship and Immigration suggest to the Select Committee for Improving Procedure that, in its second report to the Speaker of the House of Commons, it recommend that, during the week beginning October 29th, 1951, the House experiment with sittings from 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.; it being understood that it would probably also be recommended that individual speeches be limited to 30 minutes in length.

Canadian Broadcasting Corporation;
appointment

28. The Minister of National Revenue put forward a proposal for the re-appointment of a Governor of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

29. The Cabinet approved the recommendation of the Minister of National Revenue and agreed to the re-appointment of Mrs. E.S. Farr as a Governor of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation for three years from November 1st, 1951; an Order in Council to be passed accordingly.
