Among the prisoners taken by the latter were several Yankee filibusters who were summarily and very properly shot. General Blancarte had withdrawn from Lower California, for want of supplies. The Yankees from Upper California are, it seems, keeping up a regular system of aggression in that quarter, fomenting insurrections among the native inhabitants, and effecting settlements themselves doubtless with a view to a general rising when they find themselves in sufficient force.
