The Order of the day for the second reading of the Bill to make further and more stringent regulations respecting the sale of Spirituous Liquors, and to provide for the punishment of offences against Temperance, being read;

Mr. Conger moved, seconded by Mr. Clarke, and the Question being proposed,

That the Bill be now read a second time;
