Officer acting upon an Execution under any such Judgment, to receive and take such Notes in payment and satisfaction of such Execution.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so Clause mith Win. iv. c.— much of an Act passed in the seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, relating to Agricultural entitled. "An Act to protect the Public against injury from Private entitled, "An Act to protect the Public against injury from Private Banks," as relates to the Agricultural Bank, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Farmer's Banking Com-pany to issue notes pay-able on demand only.

III. And whereas the Farmers' Joint Stock Banking Company have issued Notes payable one year after date: Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall not be lawful for the Farmers' Joint Stock Banking Company, or any other Banking Company, to issue any Notes except those payable on demand, and within this Province.

CHAP. XXIV.

AN ACT to remove doubts respecting the validity of the late Elections for Aldermen and Councilmen for the City of Toronto.

[Passed 6th March, 1838.]

Preamble.

W HEREAS in consequence of the late Insurrection, the Court empowered under and by virtue of a certain Act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty William the Fourth, entitled, "An Act to alter and amend an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act to extend the limits of the Town of York, to erect the said town into a City, and to Incorporate it under the name of the City of Toronto," to hear and decide upon all objections which might be made by any Elector of the City, to the insertion or omission of names in the lists required by the said Act, of persons entitled to vote at the elections of Aldermen and Common Councilmen, and to expunge, retain and insert, names from or in the said lists, did not discharge the duties imposed by the said Act: And whereas in consequence of such omission doubts might arise as to the validity of the elections of Aldermen and Common Councilmen, or other elective Officers for the year next ensuing: And whereas it is expedient to remove such doubts, and establish the valdity of such election: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, consituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, an "Act to repeal cer-
