

BIG FLAX HARVESTS Dublin, Sept. 16.—Flax-growing in Ireland has received a remarkable impetus from the war. Before hostilimpetus from the war. Before hostilities began Ireland grew only a small proportion of the flax required by the great Ulster linen industry, but Britain's participation in the war, and the resulting restriction of flax imports from foreign countries, increased the price of flax to the point where it became a very profitable crop for the Irish farmer.

Farmers in all parts of the island are now engaged in growing flax.

Farmers in all parts of the island are now engaged in growing flax. The sudden and extraordinary prosperity of the flax-growers is being shared by the flax-workers. Male workers receive an average of \$16.00 weekly, and women average 512 weekly, wages unheard of in the productive branch of the industry before the war.
